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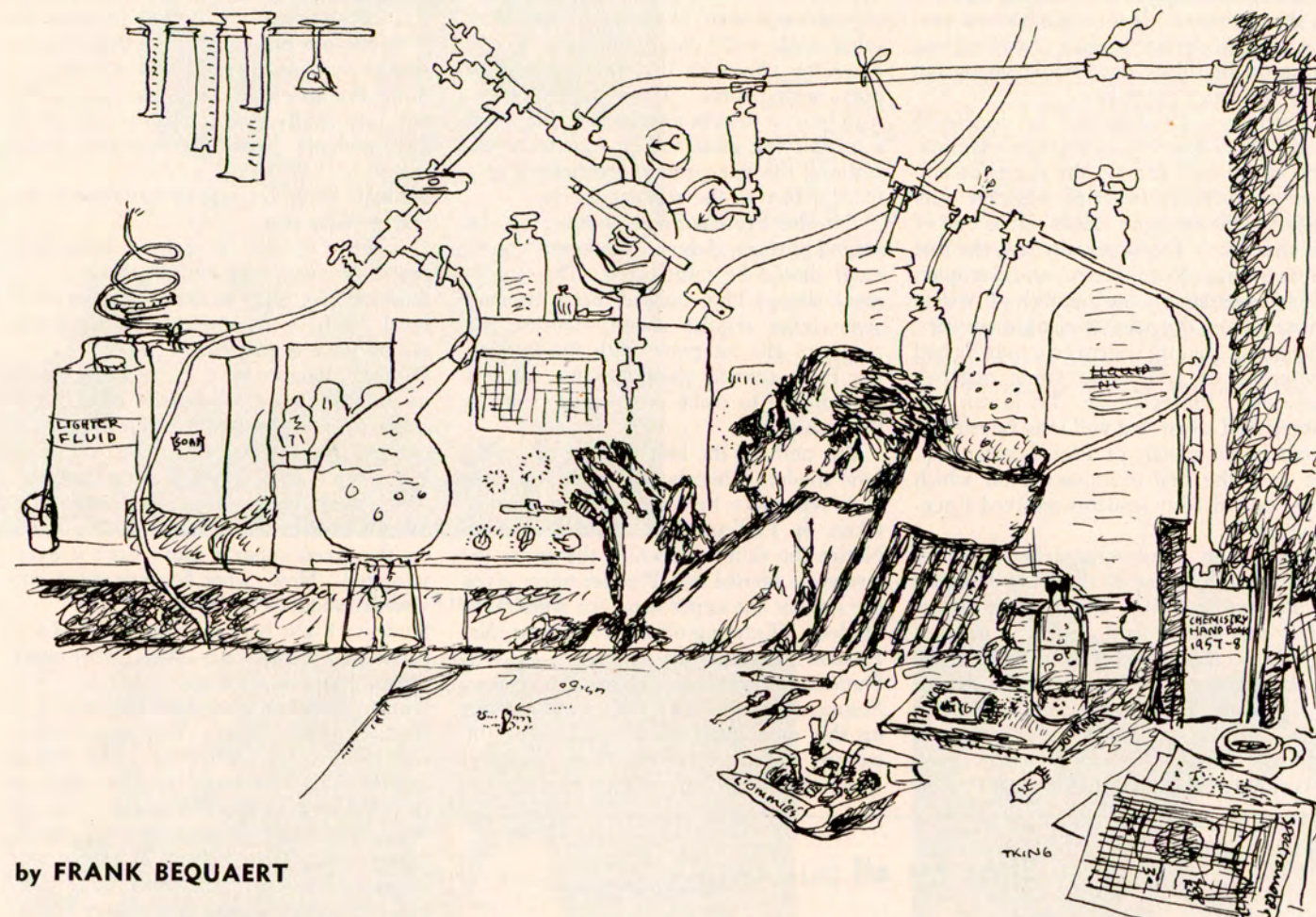


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PROFESSORMANSHIP: A DEFINITIVE ANALYSIS

Ever since that time two years ago when I felt it my duty to set forward some of the guiding principles of Studentmanship, I have been besieged with anonymous telephone calls and flooded with unsigned letters accusing me of having stated only one side of the issue, of having pushed into insignificance the role of the Professorman in the modern classroom. Nothing could have been further from my intentions. I shall confess that, caught in the fervor of my subject, the Studentman, I did perhaps neglect the truly as important contender for classroom supremacy, the Professorman. The Editors of this magazine have generously offered me space to attempt to rectify this oversight on my part. I hope that this explanation, brief though it be, will satisfy all parties concerned.

The history of Professormanship dates back, strange as it may seem, to Greek mythology and the story of the Sphinx of Thebes. This creature with the body of a lion and the wings of a bird stopped all passers and proposed a difficult question to them. If they failed to answer this question correctly, the Sphinx destroyed them. From this early beginning comes the present final examination system.

But modern Professormanship owes its beginning to Publus Ratus, the Roman scholar of the First Century B. C. A Professor at the Collegia Technicana of Rome, he is said to be the originator of the impossible laboratory experiment and the endless laboratory report. His system of blackboard notations is still in use by many Professormen today, and is just as readily misunderstood in English as it was in Latin. Publus met an untimely end at the hands of an enraged student, when he threw into the waste urn a thirty foot¹ report the student had handed in three minutes late.

Not until the Middle Ages did Professormanship take its next step forward. A French monk in the Ecole Superieur in

Paris is credited with the invention of what are known today as the three basic positions at the blackboard. The following is a direct quotation from the still standard work of the monk, Frere Pierre Gawkalis².

"The First Position: The Professorman grasps the chalk in the right hand and faces the board. He writes rapidly keeping the writing behind his body.

"The Second Position: The Professorman turns and faces the class and speaks. His body still blocks the writing on the board.

"The Third Position: The Professorman turns and rapidly erases the writing on the board."

The major American contribution to the science of modern Professormanship was made early in this Century by Stanford's own Samuel Treddown. Professorman Treddown is well remembered for his system of progressive reading assignments. He would assign a one page assignment the first week of class, two pages the second, four pages the third, eight the fourth week and so forth. By finals these assignments would have blossomed into a four or five thousand page per week stint.

Treddown is the man who first recognized the two basic divisions of Professormanship, namely Classroommanship and Officehourmanship. He composed the cardinal rule for each of these branches.

Rule One: The basic principle of Classroommanship is to keep the students confused collectively in the classroom.

Rule Two: The basic principle of Officehourmanship is to confuse the students individually if they come to you during office hours.

These rules may seem simple in themselves, but they were a

revolution in their day and are the foundation of all modern Professorship.

Treddown developed a number of interesting techniques for confusing students in the classroom. It was he who first used the now standard procedure of writing one thing on the blackboard while saying out loud the exact opposite.

Treddown also devised an ingenious system of composing ambiguous examination questions. Among the forms of ambiguous questions the triple negative true-or-false quiz question stands out as one of his triumphs. Treddown also was the first Professorman to grade true-or-false quizzes by subtracting the number of wrong answers from the number of right answers. Using this grading system on a quiz he had composed of ambiguous triple negative questions, Professorman Treddown accomplished a feat that will long be remembered in the annals of Professorship. He gave the first examination on which every one of forty students received a negative grade.

Although Treddown defined Officehourmanship as one of the basic divisions of Professorship, he did little to develop this fertile field. Only in the last decade has this region been fully exploited, again by a Stanford Professorman, Edwin Q. Flunker. Flunker discovered the principle of Busy-in-Vital-Work, which is a standard device of every Officehourman. It is simply the principle that every Profes-

sorman should appear to be completely absorbed in vital work when a student appears. For the Professorman in the Arts, Humanities, or Social Sciences this is usually accomplished by having one's desk piled high with dusty reference works. Even the chairs in the room should be piled with papers. When the Professorman hears a student approaching, he seizes a magnifying glass and appears to be examining the fine print at the bottom of a foreign text as the student enters.

For the Professorman working in the natural sciences, elaborate laboratory equipment should be constructed. This equipment should hiss, bubble, beep, or emit some other regular sound. During the course of the interview with the student, the Professorman should excuse himself periodically to make vital adjustments to this equipment.

But perhaps the best method of seeing how modern Officehourmanship operates is to reproduce here a recording recently taken in Professorman Flunker's office. Notice the skill with which the entire interview is carried out. Flunker never gives the student the upper hand for a moment. Student: (Entering office) Excuse me, Sir. Flunker: Yes, yes, what is it? Student: I hope I'm not disturbing you. Flunker: Certainly not. I'm just finishing up this monogram on the fluidity of the oxygen molecule for the Review of the International Union of Physics. Let me

move these texts off this chair, and you can sit down.

Student: I'm in Chem. I, and Flunker: Please, just a minute until I finish this calculation . . . (Mutters to himself) Pi to the nth power . . . take this integration over a curved equilinear surface . . . using Boltzman's equation . . . yes, works out very nicely for n dimensional space. (To student) Now what was your problem?

Student: Well, on page twenty-four of the text it states that . . .

Flunker: Oh, the chapter on basic concepts. Nothing very difficult there.

Student: No, Sir, I understood most of it, but I did have one question on this formula on page twenty-four . . .

Flunker: Excuse me . . . my equipment needs adjusting. (He hurries over to the other side of the room, where there is a maze of glass tubing filled with a flickering green vapor.) Just a simple adjustment. (He rotates about six knobs on a control board. There is no visible effect on the green vapor.) Can't have it oversaturated. Now, what formula were you worried about?

Student: Right here on page twenty-four. Flunker: Oh that one. Well, what don't you understand about it?

Student: I didn't know how to derive it.

Flunker: Let me see. This is a greatly simplified form, of course. The easiest way to derive the standard formula is to integrate over an inverted surface. You've had inverted surface integration, of course.

Student: No, I don't think so.

Flunker: Too bad. It's really quite difficult to understand unless you have had it. I'm afraid you'll just have to take that formula on faith until you've had a little more mathematics.

Student: Yes, Sir.

Flunker: Any other question I can help you with?

Student: No, I guess not. Thank you for your time.

Flunker: Not at all. Glad to be able to be of assistance.

Student: Thank you, Sir. Good afternoon. (Flunker is already back on his formulas and does not reply to the student as he leaves.)

This brings us up to the present in our brief analysis of Professorship. Before I close, I would like to point out that Professorship is a field with horizons unlimited. Every day Professormen are discovering new and exciting ways of confusing students. "Oh, that's all right; incidentally, your car has only been ticketed twice for over-time parking—see you in jail."



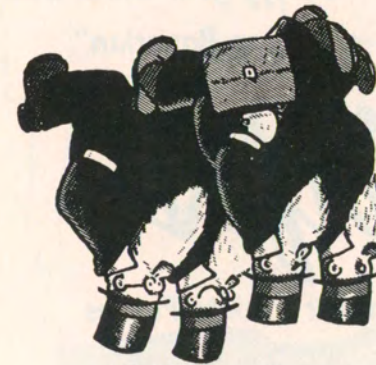
