Factor.

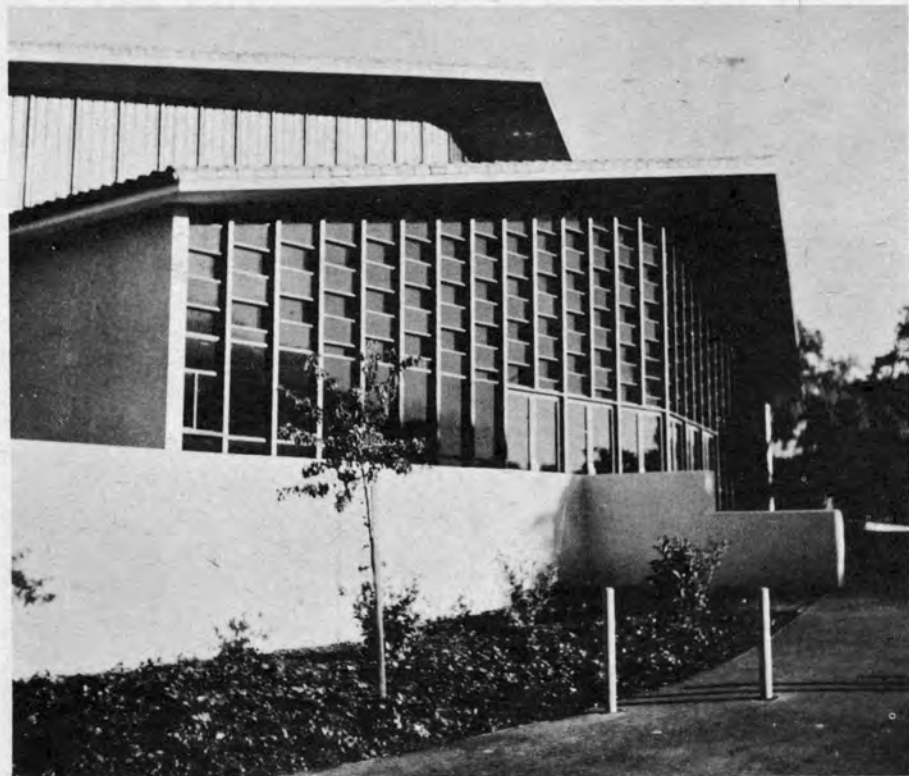
P.S. Contrary to the biblical credits at the beginning of the picture, the only task God actually performed on it was the costume design. We liked His work.

GUNFIGHT AT O.K. CORRAL

An adult western complete with the epic ballad which summarizes the childish plot in an attempt to give it magnitude. In terms of westerns, Hollywood defines "adult" as stupid, but grammatical. This picture may be so defined. The old elements are still there, but instead of going "thataway" the villain merely leaves. The whole thing is given a cocktail party polish complete with Freudian analysis and Jungian archetypes. The characters are familiar folk heroes of the wild west, Doc Holliday, Wyatt Earp, Johnny Ringo, Ike Clanton, etc. All are given romantically real characterizations that would never sneak past a juvenile audience. The code of the west is still there, but it is thoroughly rationalized to make it seem all right. Here is the curious thing about the adult western. The message is predominant but never proven, whereas if the juvenile hero said that crime didn't pay, he went out and saw to it that it damn well didn't by polishing off every minor lawbreaker in sight. Not so his adult counterpart. That stal-

wart thinks about it, sees the idiocy in his animal code which defines "brotherhood" as "the act of killing the man who has killed one's brother," regrets it, and rides off into the sunset with a saddlebag full of guilt feelings which are swiftly being assuaged by the girl on his arm. This formula leads us to the new Western Hero of "Gunfight," the two-gun pacifist whose pistol never cools off in his never-ending war on violence. It must be said for this version of Wyatt Earp that he never shot at a man who didn't shoot at him (or a close relative of his) first. In fact, things would be almost fine, if he didn't insist on talking so much about the evils of gunfire as he wipes his barrel after committing one of his acts of near genocide. I find something macabre in the idea of his turning the other cheek to a dead man. It is somehow difficult to really accept the doctrines of non-violence when a staunch proponent of the cause is constantly waving a six-gun in my face. Perhaps I'm hyper-critical of the hypocritical, but give me a juvenile western with that fine old friendly chair-breaking, bottle-smashing benevolence where the good guy is at least fairly likable, and the bad guy is inhuman enough to be forgotten.

P.S. I wouldn't have made all this fuss if they hadn't started it.



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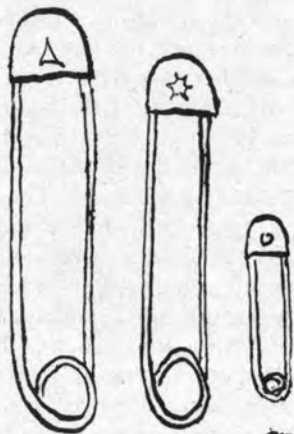
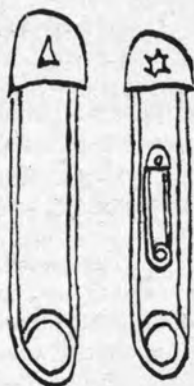
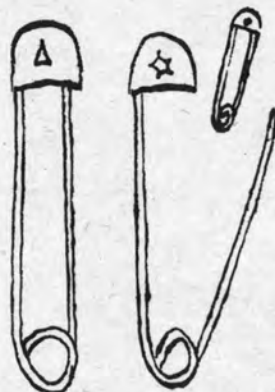
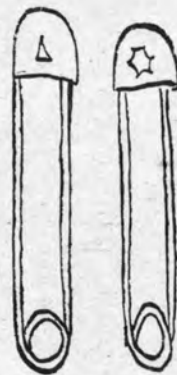
