Daily perks uncovered

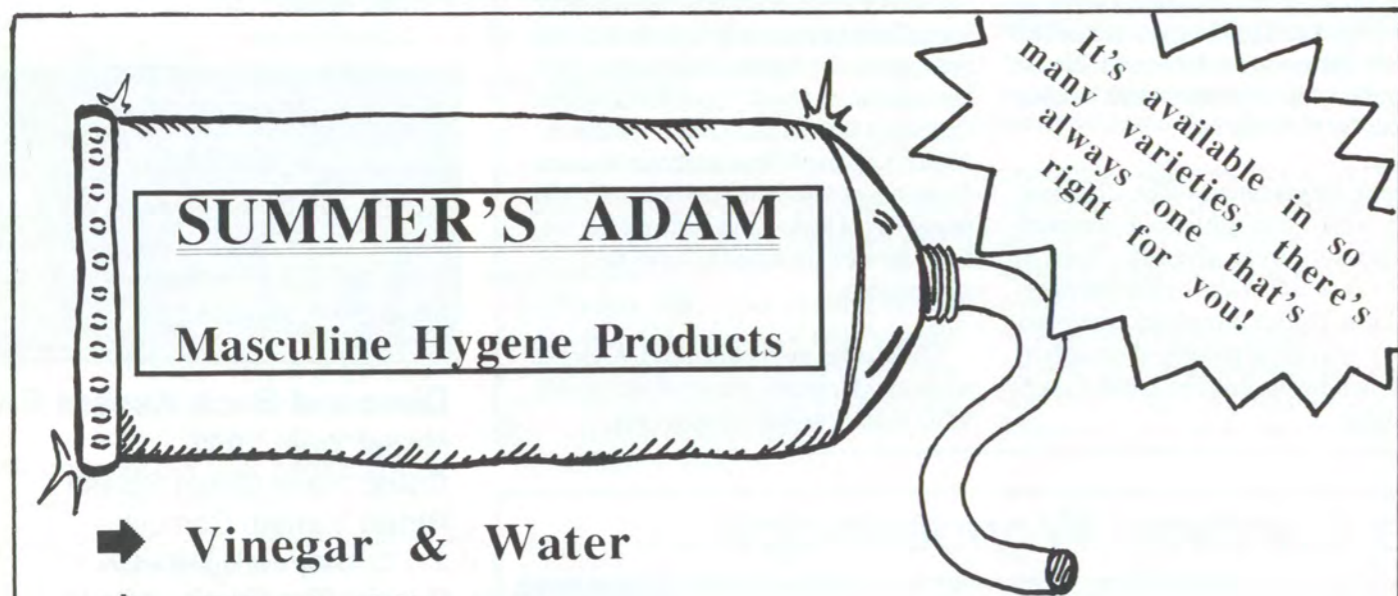

the greatest of all men.*

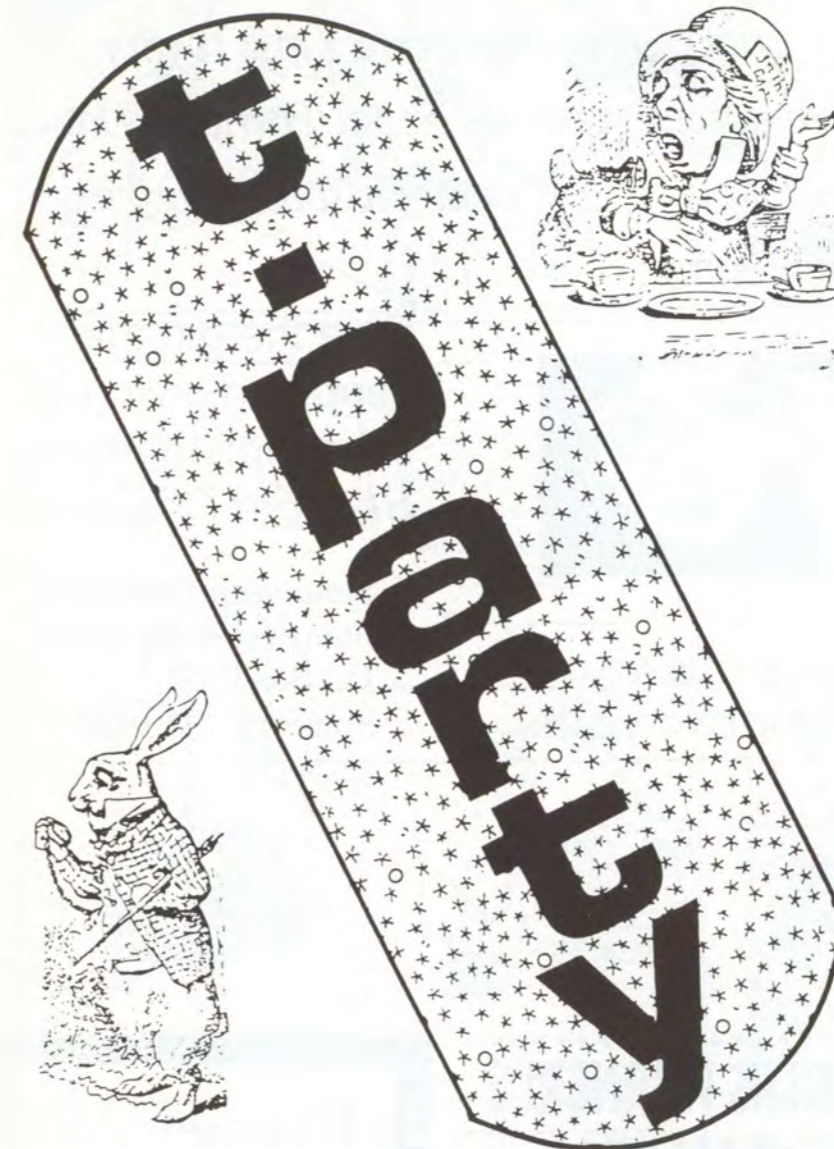
