New Shampoo Source of Controversy

Flake Away, Johnson and Johnson's newest anti-dandruff shampoo, could be more trouble than its worth, says the latest Consumer Reports, a special that offers a comprehensive review of health care products ranging from mouthwash to pedicure cream. The shampoo, designed to target flaky pieces of scalp, can lead to break-outs all over the stomach and thighs.

The rashes consist of raised red bumps that can clump together to form very uncomfortable hives. In children, the rashes can be very threatening; Consumer Reports cites multiple incidents of children under ten years of age being rushed to local hospitals because of their reactions.

A particularly significant scare occurred in Miami, Florida last spring, when fifteen elementary school students were sent to the hospital all in the same day. The children were attendees of St. Mary Magdalene Elementary, a private Catholic elementary school in a well-to-do suburb of Miami, where a lice epidemic was initially mistaken for dandruff by many parents.

In the instance of head lice, it is very common for parents to only spot the nits, or louse eggs, which look almost identical to dry flakes of scalp. In fact, sometimes louse eggs—smooth, obelisk-shaped formations that range in color from off-white to almond brown, stuck to the hair shaft at the very start of the root—can be

accompanied by dandruff structures called hair casts, which exacerbate the problem. "I had been washing Robby's hair with Flake Away for a good two weeks, trying to get rid of the flakes," said Anne Todd, mother of Robby Todd, who was rushed to the hospital with his classmates.

"It didn't seem to be working at first, but after a week or so, he didn't seem to have as many flakes. Then this horrible event happened, and our world was definitely shaken. What I thought were flakes turned out to be lice and so this reaction could have completely not happened. I am very upset with Johnson and Johnson. It is one thing to sell a health product that could be harmful to grown people, but to endanger the life of a kid, much less mine, is pretty bad."

The fifteen youngsters had to unfortunately spend the night in City Hospital, only to be released early the next morning to attend St. Mary Magdalene's for the day. "At least it's Friday," said a reluctant Robby Todd, as he trudged up the steps to school. Flake Away has already been taken off the shelf in all of Florida, and Johnson and Johnson expects a decrease in half its revenue from the product in the next couple of months.

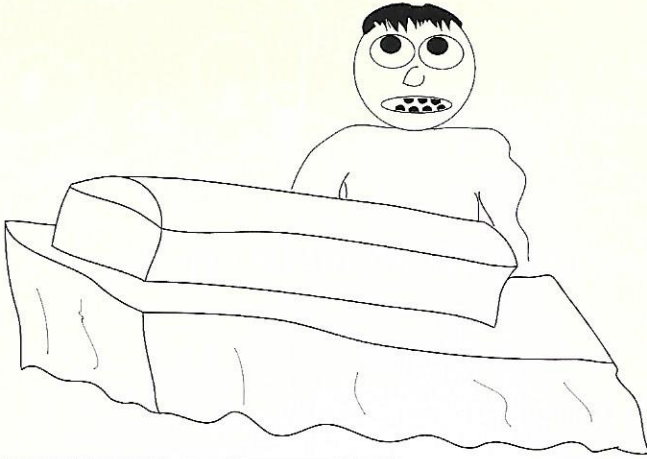

Air West has chosen to file a formal complaint against you in the Troublesome Air Passenger Registry. The procedure for TAPR arbitration has changed slightly since you came before the FAA last April. Please pay very close attention to the conditions laid out in this letter, as violation of your travel suspension could result in Denial of Boarding.

While we are investigating the alleged disruption, you are not allowed to fly on any commercial airlines in the United States. You may not make "charitable donations" in the names of any FAA-registered airlines. You may not ask airlines for favors. And, of course, it should go without saying that you may not apply to work at any airline.

All of your frequent flyer mile counts will be reset to Ø.

We understand that you have a deep and personal interest in the air travel industry. Please understand that this decision is just as emotional for us as it is for you. Our constituent air carriers would undoubtedly love to see you return to your days as a frequent—though courteous and well-contained—air traveler. We stand united behind them as an Aviation Administration in hopes that your suspension will foster continued progress towards a safe and commercially marketable air travel industry.

- ✓ Many bags can look alike. If you are confused about the identity of your bag, try checking the name tag on it. If you are still unsure, do your best to work out the situation without disrupting the business of the airport staff.
- ✓ Most rental cars do not allow smoking. Be sure to ask before confirming your travel plans.
- ✓ Electronic boarding cards are now required on all flights. Processing times vary with location, airport, and various circumstance.
- ✓ Parking is reserved for airport staff only.
- ✓ Together, the FAA is making the skies a safer and more convenient place for everyone.
- ✓ If you are having trouble finding a location in any of the FAA's 2300 airports, please refer to the color-coded maps conveniently located on various weight-bearing pillars across America.

- ✓ Many airlines allow you to bypass security checkpoints if you are willing to pass silently before the all-watching eyes of the electronic x-ray machines.
- ✓ These are the fuel efficiencies for various U.S. aircraft. Boeing 707- 1,000249, Airbus (all models) (not a U.S. aircraft) 1,2145111, Boeing 747- 1,9994, MD-80- 1,000249, DC-10- 1,6204 (flat gradient), (DC floating point information is not available), Sky Schooner- 9,10.
- ✓ Pack wisely. You are only allowed to check two bags and carry-on one or two. Furthermore, if you lose track of which baggages are your own, airport employees will not be able to help you.

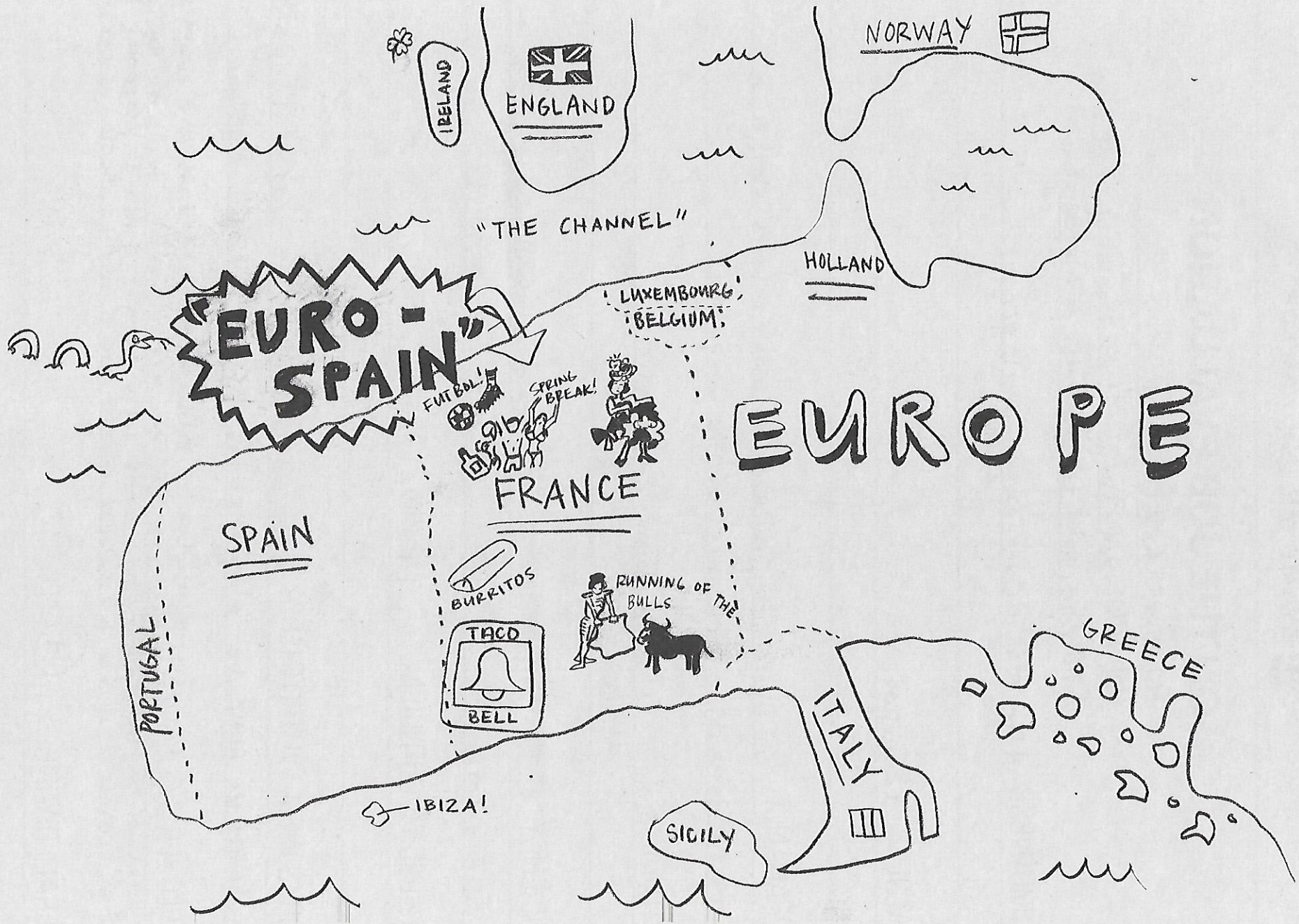

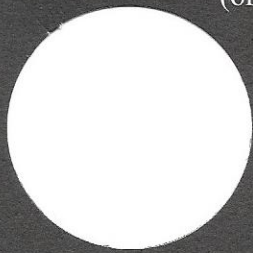

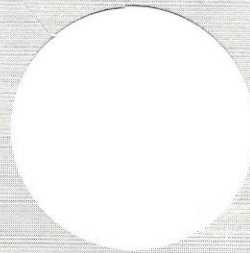
